RESOLUTION 82-7

WHEREAS, it is contemplated that the City of TAYLOR will need an additional water supply to supplement the existing supply and

WHEREAS, relief of the high FLOURIDE content in existing supply is necessary and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this COUNCIL to rectify these situations and provide a plentiful and safe water supply to the citizens of Taylor and

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to accept a contract from SOUTHWEST WATER PIPELINE to supply the CITY of TAYLOR with a minimum of 1,000,000 gallons of water per year.

The Taylor City Council held their regular meeting on Dec. 6, 1982. All members were present. Mayor position was filled by Council President Gordon Vaagen.

A Public hearing was held regarding a contract with Southwest Water Pipeline. The Council had to make a decision whether or not the city wanted to contract water from this pipeline. Nine citizens were present.

Gerald Rice made the motion to vote on the acceptance or rejection of the contract. Seconded by Orin Christianson. Vote was as follows: Orin Christianson Yes; Gerald Rice- No; Lorraine Legacie- Yes.

Motion to accept the resolution was made by Gerald Rice, seconded by Lorraine Legacie. Resolution #82-12-6: Let it be resolved that the City of Taylor by a 2 to 1 vote sign to contract water from Southwest Water Pipeline for a minimum of 1,000,000 gallons per year.

Motion to adjourn by Gerald Rice seconded by Lorraine Legacie- Carried.
